





IELTS (International English Language Testing System)

ESP – forms of learning

Formal learning


 "Formal education is highly institutionalized, bureaucratic, curriculum driven, and formally recognized with grades, diplomas, or certificates"

Non-formal learning

- Organized learning outside of the formal education system.
- Tends to be short-term and voluntary.
- Typically has a curriculum and often a facilitator

Informal learning

- Outside the formal system, unstructured.
- A lifelong process through which learners acquire attitudes, values, skills and knowledge from daily experience

Types of informal learning

- self-directed learning: intentional and conscious
- incidental learning: accidental by-product of doing something else, is unintentional but after the experience she or he becomes aware that some learning has taken place
- socialization, or tacit learning: neither intentional nor conscious (although we can become aware of this learning later through 'retrospective recognition')




